**Here are a few of our programs that your gifts will help to support:**

- October, 2017 – Training the Trainer Capacity Building Workshop (TOT) for up to 22 short-term **mission leaders**. Participants are serving in medically underserved communities both here in the USA and abroad. We seek to equip the learners with the tools and resources necessary to help those whom they serve find answers to personal and community health problems that are proactive, reproducible and which build capacity and sustainability. The cost for up to 6 nights lodging, meals, materials, trainers, etc. is \$600/person.
- *Once the training is completed, all those in attendance will be qualified to train others across the world.*



- LIMM will be hosting a 4-5 day TOT in late 2017/early 2018 in Togo, West Africa, requested by the LCMS workers on the field, along with the national church leaders serving in Togo. Projected costs are \$3000-4000/person.
- TOT training in Belize: LIMM has sent nurses in 2015 and 2016 to plant the seeds. Now, with a full time LCMS pastor serving in Belize, we can continue our training with community volunteers.

- Travel grants for Lutheran Parish Nurses working in underserved countries to attend the Lutheran Parish Nurse International (LPNI) 2017 Study Tour (\$2,000 per person).
- Supporting parish nurses and other medical workers in Madagascar, Papua New Guinea, Palestine, West Africa, etc. with funding for repairs, teaching materials, supplies, and further educational opportunities.
