Cambodia Community Health Education Program Report Betty Roon, April 23 – May 11, 2009

I traveled to Siem Reap with **Dr. Lima** to meet with **Pastor Vuthy** and the five ladies who have been receiving health lessons in preparation for CHE. Since my last visit in October, 2008, Pastor Vuthy and the ladies have completed health assessments on every family who attends their church. They also have received one to two health lessons per month from Dr. Lima which they in turn have shared with their 10 assigned families. Dr. Lima and I were able to visit with four of these families to assess the interest and effectiveness of the lessons. I am extremely pleased to report that all four families could recite the lessons taught.

Pastor Vuthy had selected two villages where the CHE program will be begun. He has committed his personal and congregational support to both locations. Koskrabou Village, about 1 hour away from his church, is a very poor village. He has already worked with a local NGO to obtain two cows for the village. Pastor Vuthy told the village chief of the lessons his ladies have been learning from Dr. Lima and the Ladies Health Seminar and offered to come to teach the village those same lessons. The five ladies that had been trained last year, recruited and taught 11 more individuals from their church. 16 people plus Pastor Vuthy provided lessons on diarrhea, colds and food groups to over 50 people. They did a truly outstanding job. I cannot express in words how proud and impressed I was of Pastor Vuthy and these original 5 ladies; first for their heart and passion for helping others and second their ability to make things happen. This wasn't something they just talked about, but did, without our input or encouragement.

Ladies Seminar May 4-6, 2009: Approximately 2/3 attended last year's seminar and 1/3 were first time attendees. A total of 26 ladies and 3 pastors attended the entire seminar. Lessons were First Aid, CPR-Choking, First Responder and Community Resources. Having seen the Siem Reap ladies do their lessons in Koskrabou I invited them to present a lesson at the seminar on 'Colds' which included sanitation and nutrition. They did a great job with Pastor Vuthy running a powerpoint while the ladies did lecture and demonstrations. They also passed out well designed handouts. The ladies all received first aid kits which were prepared and donated by Global Health Ministries and University of Michigan nursing staff of 7B/C. All 26 ladies and the 3 pastors worked very hard and participated in all the lessons. They were accurate and creative in their return lessons and demonstrations.
