Nebulizers for Madagascar



LIMM and its faithful donors heard Dr. Harison's request for an Omron nebulizer (shown in the picture). Dr. Harison from the Andranomadio Lutheran Hospital wrote, "Grace and Peace to you in Jesus Name...by the grace of God we all are doing well here, busy at the hospital but struggling with political situation which make the hospital in difficulties because the government has started to ask a big amount for taxes. We do not know how it will go, but God will make a way. Please may I ask for help for the hospital...our portable nebulizer which we used for emergency everywhere at the hospital is broken, and this is not available in Madagascar. It is easy to use this small machine because it is just a battery." Nebulizers are used frequently in Madagascar for shortness of breath, coughs, flu,

pneumonia, and asthma. One of our Board members found three of them online for \$120 each. The LCMS Medical Mission team leaving for Antsirabe, Madagascar took them in their luggage and delivered them this month. Dr. Harison thanks LIMM for its donation of three nebulizers to the hospital.





Community Health Education (CHE) heads to Belize

From June 8th-15th, LIMM Interim Executive Director and CHE trainer Sharon Thomas led the women's ministry and CHE training program in the village of Seine Bight, Belize. She was assisted by Dianna



Peterson and Hilda Avila to provide 8 training classes in both English and Spanish. The courses taught were both medical and spiritual. Medical classes included *Female Growth/Development, Menopause, Understanding and Managing Diabetes,* and *Living with Hypertension.* The spiritual classes were *Forgiveness, Compassion Leads to Kindness, Being a Good Neighbor,* and *Thankfulness.* Along with the lessons, activities were performed around each lesson to enhance the teaching. For example, after the *Thankfulness* lesson, participants created beautiful thank you cards to give to a friend.

Sharon brought along professional photos of the village that the women used to create the cards. Then, each participant created a card to keep as a reminder to be kind to herself and to give thanks for her blessings. Sharon was also able to spend one day teaching in the public school and used CHE lessons on *Female Growth and Development* and *How a Baby Grows* to explain basic health and hygiene principles to the teenage girls. Even though the school is public, she was able to share the Gospel message and pray with the students. Thank you to our donors for your commitment to health education and sharing of the Gospel!



Community Health Education (CHE) in St. Louis, Missouri

Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA), another RSO of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, asked LIMM to conduct three one-hour CHE training sessions on *Growth and Development, Stages of*

Development, and *Sexually Transmitted Infections.* LIMM Interim Executive Director Sharon Thomas answered the call. Students present were both Christian and Muslim from Napoli, Somalia, and India. All classes were interactive; tests were submitted upon completion of each subject taught.



All tests were reviewed in class



with additional teaching provided for any incorrect responses (there was only one incorrect answer in three days). At the end of each day, additional time was provided for students who asked to speak with Sharon personally to discuss questions on topics covered in class. Feedback from adult volunteers was extremely positive and plans for future subjects were discussed at length. Sharon commented, "I feel that this was an incredible opportunity to participate with CFNA and that all training objectives were overwhelmingly successful". Many thanks to Sharon for her expertise in health education and thank you CFNA for the invitation!
