


Lutherans in Medical Missions Fall 2025

LIMM Goes to Belize



LIMM Executive Director Sharon Thomas, RN, along with Andrea Ferguson, RN, BSN traveled to Belize with LCMS in late August to teach Community health education classes in Western Belize. This trip has been a dream of Sharon's since her first trip to Belize in 2012 with the Belize Mission Society, and she was very excited to see it come to fruition.

Andrea Ferguson writes, "Lutherans in Medical Missions (LIMM) and LCMS International Missions provided Community Health Evangelism/Education in Valley of Peace, Belize from 27 August through 03 September 2025. There were seven volunteers: Sharon Thomas, RN

(LIMM Executive Director), Kristin Dye, PT, Alice Layne, RN, Lisa Rathjen, RN, Janet Hitzeman, RN, Steve Hitzeman, O.D., and Andrea Ferguson, RN (LIMM Chairman).

Erin Mackenzie, LCMS Regional Volunteer Coordinator and Deaconess Tirzah Krey, Regional Human Care Coordinator provided exceptional guidance. Pastor Benjamin Flores, Pastor Jason Groth, Pastor Micah Wildauer, Pastor Herbert Burch, and their families welcomed us into their homes and shared the Belizean and Central American culture with the team.

Valley of Peace, Little Lambs Preschool teachers, Pastors and their families, as well as members of the community attended the various classes. Topics taught by the nurses included: First Aid, CPR, discipline methods for preschool children, nutrition, child development, Overuse of Technology and alcoholism. Dr. Hitzeman and Andrea Ferguson, RN completed vision and hearing screenings on 24 preschool children. Several children failed their vision and/or hearing screening which will require further evaluation and treatment. The



team was blessed to witness the work of the Inspiration Center who, alongside the Valley of Peace Mercy House, provide care, such as physical therapy, to children with disabilities."
